

#### 04. MEMBERSHIP

##### 04.1 Dues

Shall be established by the Representative Board based upon recommendations made by the Executive Board.

##### 04.2 Individual (NYSAAA & NIAAA)

1. A person is qualified to become an Individual member of this association with full privileges and benefits, if he/she is employed on a full or part time basis by a school district in New York State and has among his/her responsibilities the administration of the interscholastic athletic program of that school or district.
2. The individual shall agree to comply with the constitution of this Association, make application to the Treasurer of this Association and submit membership dues.

##### 04.3 Associate (NYSAAA only)

1. An individual or organization is qualified to participate as an NYSAAA member in the meetings and activities specified by the Executive Board providing:
  - a. He/she is employed by an institution or is a member of an organization which is involved in school administration (e.g. a school principal or superintendent, Section employee, State Department employee, or School Board member).
  - b. He/she has been an individual member of this Association, but no longer qualifies for that membership classification because of change in employment or job classification.
  - c. He/she is an instructor in an athletic administration curriculum of an institution of higher education.
  - d. An associate member is not eligible to vote.

##### 04.4 Retired (NYSAAA only)

1. An individual is eligible for Retired membership if he/she has been a regular member of this Association but no longer qualifies for that membership classification because of retirement.
2. The retired member shall agree to comply with the Articles and bylaws of this Association and make application to the Association along with dues.

##### 04.5 Honorary Lifetime Members

May be bestowed on individuals by the Representative Board. There shall be no dues or voting privileges for such a member.

##### 04.6 Student Membership

Is for anyone enrolled in a college undergraduate or graduate program and is not

actively involved in athletic administration.

04.7 Membership Year

The membership year shall be on a rolling basis (one year from the date joined or renewed, based on payment date).
